St. Paul voters will have a chance to voice their opinion of Instant Runoff Voting (IRV) on November 3rd, 2009.

Recently the Minnesota Supreme Court ruled IRV (also called Ranked Choice Voting) completely constitutional. It is used in other states and other countries. It will be used this year in Minneapolis.

Instant Runoff Voting (a.k.a. Ranked Choice Voting) is a ranked ballot method of voting that results in a winner chosen by a majority of the voters in a single-seat race. Voters simply rank candidates according to their preference - 1st, 2nd, 3rd choice, etc. This means that voters can vote for their favorite candidate knowing that if he or she lacks the support needed to win, their vote can continue to count toward their second or third choice with a better chance of winning. There are no wasted votes and no spoilers. And voters are spared the expense and inconvenience of a second run-off election.

Used by cities across the country and democracies around the world, Instant Runoff Voting brings more people into the process, gives voters greater choice, makes elections more competitive and fosters more positive and informative campaigns.
